On May 18, 2022, Kenneth Thomas McConnell Jr. of Fort Denaud, Florida went to be with our Lord Jesus. Ken was born in Baltimore, Maryland on January 18, 1950. He served in the Marine Corps as an Armor and completed a tour of Viet Nam serving on the front lines in the An Hoa Valley. He returned to civilian life and worked in the flooring and transportation industry and lived in Anne Arundel County, Maryland. In 1994 he moved his family to Meadow Mountain in Garrett County where he opened Ken's Carpet Corral. In 2013 Ken retired and he and his wife moved from Maryland to Florida. Ken was a music lover, who worshipped and played bass guitar at Cowboy Church in LaBelle and was a member of Disabled American Veterans Chapter 144. He is known for his sense of humor, love and devotion to God and family and his collection of guitars. Ken is preceded in death by his father Kenneth McConnell, Sr. and his mother Dolores McConnell. He is survived by his wife Yvonne, his three boys, Kenneth III, Nathan and Michael, five grandsons Brandon, Gavin, Christian, Weston, Owen, and his first granddaughter Meadow as well as his siblings Gary, Jimmy, Brad and Pam. He is greatly missed by all including his service dog Wolfbain.

A Memorial Service was held at Cowboy Church on May 22 and a funeral with full Military Honors is planned for June 30, 2022 at Rocky Gap National Cemetery in Flintstone, Maryland at 2:00 PM.
