Anton Harazin, 91 (deceased January 7, 2021)

Mr. Anton Harazin passed away peacefully at his home in Sarasota, Florida with his loving daughters by his side. He was born on 4/12/1929 in Chicago. Anton "Tony" Harazin was the son of the late Anton J. Harazin and Josephine Lucasik Harazin of Chicago.

He was predeceased by his wife of 45 years Myrtle Harazin, his Sister Gloria Jean Koscilniak and Brother Edward Harazin. He is survived by his daughters Deborah Radek and husband Bob, and Beth Harazin of Sarasota, son Marcus Harazin and wife Ann of Delmar, 4 grandsons, and 2 great grandchildren, and several nieces and nephews.

Anton received his Bachelor of Fine Arts from the Art Institute of Chicago and his Master of Arts degree in Arts Education from Columbia University. He graduated from Harrison High School in Chicago.

In 1992 he retired after 36 years of teaching art primarily at Knox Junior High School in the Johnstown, New York School District. He immensely enjoyed working with his fellow teachers and the many students that he interacted with there. He was always thrilled when he learned a former student went on to pursue a career in the arts. He also ran the Adult Education program for the Johnstown School District for many years. He taught previously for the

BOCES system in Perth, Oppenheim-Ephratah, Mecos, Wheelerville, and Stratford Schools, at Jefferson Junior High School in Dubuque, Iowa and was a visiting art instructor at East Tennessee University.

Mr. Harazin was an active artist throughout his career creating a wonderful array of watercolors of landscapes in the Mohawk Valley and many other areas. His work exhibited in many shows locally. His work was featured at the Fulton County Art show and he received the Iowa State Art Show painting award.

Mr. Harazin also worked previously for Arlene Sitterly Realty and Mary Chmura Realty in Fulton County. Mr. Harazin was a founding board member of the Shirley Luck Senior Citizen Center in Johnstown and also served on the Board of the Fulton County Chapter of the Red Cross. He and his wife had also been active in the Colonial Little Theater in Johnstown. He enjoyed his spending 53 summers at his camp on Canada Lake, New York with his family and winters in Sarasota, Florida.

The family will hold a private celebration of his life later in the year in Sarasota and at West Canada Lake.
