Arden A. Weich, 92, of Bradenton, Florida, passed away Thursday, Oct. 14, 2022. She was preceded in death by her husband, Max Weich, and son, Dale Weich. Survivors are her daughter Debbie (Don) Wren, and son Dean (Susan) Weich, seven grandchildren, Ryan, Jessica, Nicholas, Chris, Tom, DJ and Rachel

and four great-grandchildren, Brittani, Colby, Kilynn and River.

Arden was born in Ancon,, Panama Canal Zone, and was always proud to share

a story or song from her birthplace. She graduated from Cristobal High School,

where she was a cheerleader and a straight-A student. She got married April 20,

1951, and after the birth of her son Dale, she and her husband moved to the St.

Louis area, where she lived until she moved to Florida at age 89.

Arden was a longtime member of Grace Church St. Louis, where she was a door

greeter, served on the prayer team and for the nursing home, prison and homeless ministries. She also worked with Benny Hinn Ministries, including a mission trip to bring Bibles to China, and helped collect hundreds of jars of peanut butter for Ministry of Love's Thanksgiving food baskets. Arden was a member of the International Fellowship of Christian Businessmen and

volunteered for Christian Hospitals for many years.

Arden was an animal lover, a ballroom dancer, and a competitive putt-putt player,

but above all else, she was an evangelist for Jesus Christ. Whether Arden was in

the drive-thru of a fast-food restaurant, purchasing an item from a department store or having a medical procedure, she shared the Good News with everyone.

Visitation is set for 10:30 a.m. Saturday, October 22, in the community chapel at

Grace Church, 2695 Creve Coeur Mill Road, in Maryland Heights. A celebration

of life will follow at 11 a.m. Arden loved balloons, so a balloon launch will conclude the service in the parking lot. She asked that those attending wear bright colors, including her favorite, royal blue. Friends and family are welcome at

a luncheon afterward in the church cafeteria.
