Brandon Michael Pozzie died suddenly on May 3, 2025 at the age of 25. Brandon was the beloved son of Joseph and Michelle Pozzie, and beloved brother of Brianna Pozzie. A resident of North Port FL for most of his life, he was home schooled and later a dual enrolled student at State College of Florida, receiving his Associate of Arts, majoring in Business Administration and Management. Brandon later received his Bachelor of Business Administration from Southeastern University. Brandon was also a member of the golf team at Southeastern University. Golf was a large part of Brandon's life starting as a young boy. Brandon at age 5 participated in The First Tee for several years. As a high school senior, he was selected by the First Tee to play at the Nature Valley First Tee Open at Pebble Beach alongside Champion's Tour Player Paul Broadhurst. Brandon also coached successful PGA Jr League teams, served as lead coach growing a new First Tee location in North Port, and helped many players of all ages

improve their game. Brandon was also the assistant golf professional at Heron Creek Golf and Country Club. Brandon loved everything about the Armed Forces and knew everything about our country's military history, especially the history of our early wars and our war planes. He was in training hard in preparations to join the military as either a Navy Seal or a Ranger. Brandon was a soft spoken, kind-hearted young man with enormous dreams and aspirations who loved mentoring and coaching youth through golf. Brandon is remembered as a fun loving and caring son, brother, grandson, cousin, and friend. Both of his grandfathers, Ed Handel and Frank Pozzie, preceded Brandon in death. Brandon's grandmothers, Sharon Burke and Janie Handel, and many aunts, uncles, cousins, friends, parents, sister, are all heart-broken at the loss of Brandon. Brandon will be greatly missed.

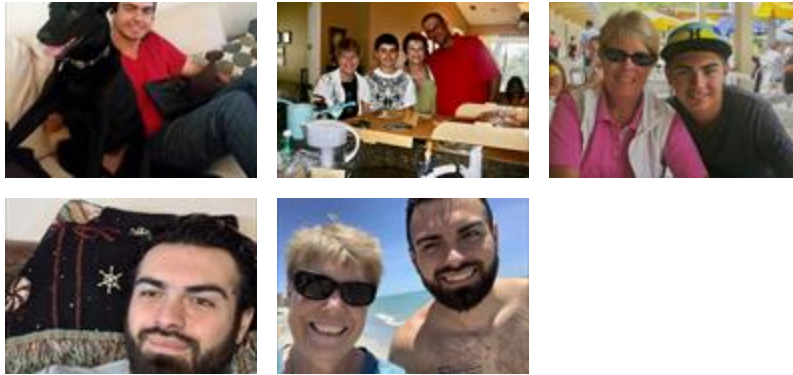

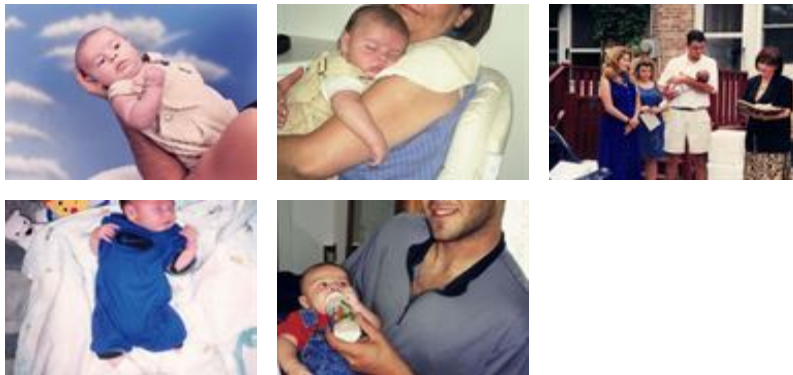

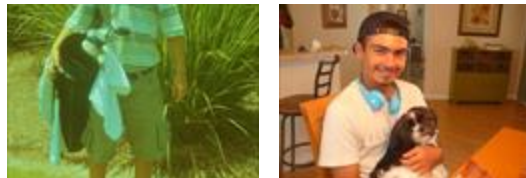
