It was so wonderful having our families together. You always welcomed everyone into your home even if they were not family. We always got together to celebrate the holidays and birthdays. We would have a double celebration on August 21st for Mamie and Fran since they were born on that date.

The trips that we took together: oh, what memories were made! Fran & I loved to travel with you and Louie. We all received the VIP treatment since he was handicapped. We had the best seats, service and did not have to wait on any lines. Louie would always joke and say that we only took him along because of the VIP treatment we would get.

When Mamie passed away it was just you, Fran and I left. We would keep in touch by phone every Sunday morning at 10:00AM. I would call you and talk a long time about what was going on in our

family as well as in yours. Fran & I would try to come down for a visit as much as we could. We will always remember our last visit, the weekend before Thanksgiving. We went to your favorite restaurant we wine and dined and had a great time. That was the last time that we saw each other. The next day you became so sick with your back pain we tried to help you but we couldn't and that is when Billy and Bella came to take care of you. When you could no longer take care of yourself, Louis and Caroline came to bring you to their home in Florida.

We want to express our gratitude to Lou & Caroline for taking such good care of you. Words cannot convey how much we appreciate what they have done. You will be sadly missed by so many people for your laughter, love and thoughtfulness.
