Charlie Morris, 53, of Port Charlotte, Florida unexpectedly passed into our hearts on February 4, 2012. He was a polymath who loved life and was loved by a large family and well respected by his colleagues at Charlotte County Schools.

Born on February 26, 1958 in Neptune, New Jersey, the son of Joyce (Bartley) and Chuck Morris, Charles Lundy Morris III moved around the eastern seaboard with his family as a young man. He surfed and sailed and played defense on the Woodham High School football team. Upon graduation, he joined the Air Force and became an aircraft inspection technician after being a member of an outstanding rifle team. He rowed for the College of the Citadel, later becoming a boat captain, and graduated with a Bachelor of Arts degree from Ohio University. Through it all, it was sailing that led him to his true passion in life: teaching math to kids and technology to teachers. Herein also lies his greatest achievement: loving everyone unconditionally and equally whether they were family members, students in a Marine Institute or a Governor's Scholars program, or teachers in a close knit cadre or spread across his FIRN TECH territory in the state of Florida.

Charlie leaves to cherish his loving memory his wife Sarah Jane as well as members of her family: Suzanne Skinner; Ray Skinner; Elizabeth and Mark Anthony; Patty Blaine, Jim, Emily, Katie, and Jessica Mills; and James

Anthony. He was preceded into heaven by Patricia Skinner.

Charlie was also blessed to include numerous extended family members and friends among the people he loved dearly.

Charlie was a kind, interesting, and fascinating renaissance man. As far back as 1977 Charlie served the United States Air Force as a non-destructive Inspection Technician. In this role he examined aircraft using X-Ray, Ultrasound, Magnaflux, Penetrant, and Eddy Current Methods. In other words, Charlie was a techie before most people even knew what tech was! Years later in the mid 80?s Charlie received his United States Coast Guard Master license and began teaching at the Palm Beach Marine Institute. He worked with children teaching them sailing skills. He also taught snorkeling and acted as a safety diver for scuba training. Charlie was a certified CPR/First-Aid instructor and taught those skills to both students and staff.

Around this time Charlie also began teaching Math and started to forge his academic career. He served as the Associate Director of the Governors Scholars Program for Talented and Gifted Students in Athens Ohio for several years before moving to Florida to become a Math teacher. While he was at Mariner his love of technology continued to flourish. Charlie became the tech specialist for his school and also the school?s site contact for the Florida Information Resource Network (FIRN). His gift for helping people move into the telecommunication age paved the path for him to become a Network Technology Education Consultant for the Florida Department of Education. He provided professional development classes to teachers in the Southwest region of Florida while based in Charlotte County.

Charlie was gifted in both Mathematics and Technology, and his love of both of these areas led him to the next chapter of his professional life as a Teacher on assignment to assist in the integration of a new student information system. Charlie?s calming demeanor and his ability to work with teachers ensured the success of this highly technical implementation.

During the last chapter of his professional life, Charlie's impact on education reached new heights. He served Charlotte County as a trainer for the department of Learning Through Technology. In this role he played an integral part in the lives of teachers as they created their classrooms of tomorrow. Charlie's strength helped us through the good times and the bad. Over the last 15 years he helped open 10 brand new schools and many temporary campuses in the aftermath of hurricane Charley. But perhaps his crowning achievement was in the implementation of the Learning Through Technology Teacher Cadre. Charlie's work with this program will have lasting ripples through time. As a direct result of his efforts the course of how instruction is delivered in Charlotte County has forever changed.

Charlie, we love you and we will miss you. Thank you for everything you gave to us. More importantly, thank you for everything you did for the students of Charlotte County Public Schools.
