July 17, 1934 - August 21, 2013

Christine A. Nunes, age 79, of Naples, Florida and formerly of Kingston and Stony Hill Jamaica, passed away suddenly on August 21, 2013.

She was born on July 17, 1934 in Kingston, Jamaica, the daughter of Carmen Iris (Corinaldi) and Dennis Groom Davidson. She married Colonel Michael K. Nunes who nurtured her love for the sea. As his loving wife, she became the beloved center and matriarch of the family and was affectionately known as mother to an entire generation of Royal Jamaica Yacht Club Youth. Sailing remained close to her heart and the couple was active in the Jamaican and American sailing communities. Christine was also very involved in the Jamaican community at large, as a columnist in the Daily Gleaner, and served tirelessly in the executive group of the Jamaican chapter of the General Federation of Woman's clubs and it's Woman's Home on Lady Musgrave Road.

Christine leaves behind her children Stephen Nunes and Catherine Honiball, and stepchildren Margaret Earnshaw, Tony Nunes and Anne Lee. She is also survived by 9 loving grandchildren. Sadly, she is preceded in death by her husband Michael, her step-sister Aileen and her brother Richard.

A Memorial Service for Christine will be celebrated at 10 AM on Saturday, August 31, 2013 at Saint Monica's Episcopalia Church, 7070 Immokalee

Road, Naples, Florida 34119. The family has made special lodging arrangements for those attending from out-of-town, - "The Christine Nunes Memorial Service," with the Wyndham Naples, 3557 Pine Ridge Road, Naples, Florida 34109, (239) 593-1300.
