Craig Louis Beaudoin, 60, of Cape Coral, Florida passed away May 3, 2012, after a long, arduous and courageous battle against cancer. He died as a result of complications from Acute Myelogenous Leukemia(AML). He gave the disease one hell of a fight but unfortunately for his loved ones he was needed somewhere else. From early in his life he worked for the family construction business, HW Beaudoin & Sons. Craig married Denise in 1973 and in the same year would eventually move to Fort Myers, Florida with his family and the business. As one of the owners, he operated and oversaw the completion of numerous projects throughout the SWFL area, ranging in many different aspects of construction.

After his construction days, he ventured into real estate, beginning his career as a Florida realtor with Prudential Florida Realty, and ending it with Coldwell Banker. His wonderful personality, gift-of-gab and genuine tone allowed him to enjoy a successful career selling homes, and received many awards and much recognition among his peers.

Along his journey through life he would become a family man. In August 1980, Craig became a father to son Sean, and then again in January 1985, to son Mathew.
