David Arthur Oesterheld, a resident of Naples, FL, died on Tuesday, June 9, 2020. He was dearly loved and is greatly missed by his wife, Mary-Ann Oesterheld, his stepdaughters, Tara Eskesen and Kathryn Berg, son-in-law, Michael Berg, grandchildren Bennett, Reese, and Ethan Eskesen, sister and brother-in-law Janet Oesterheld Greaves and Randy Greaves, brother and sister-in-law Douglas Oesterheld and Kathleen Oesterheld, nephew Daniel Oesterheld, and many loving friends.

David was born in New Rochelle, NY, on May 20, 1943, to Arthur and Florence Oesterheld. In 1965, he received his Economics degree with special honors from Dartmouth College. He served in the U.S. Army until 1968 and spent much of that time stationed as a Captain in Baumholder, Germany. In 1970, he went on to earn his M.B.A. in Accounting/Finance at Indiana University. David's distinguished career included many prominent positions in banking and finance as a CPA, CEO, and CFO before becoming Vice President of Budgeting at J.P. Morgan Chase in New York City.

David was married to his late wife Susan Bergholtz for 34 years and then married Mary-Ann in 2011. He cherished and cared for his newly inherited daughters and grandchildren like they were his own. His mantra was "Family

first, no matter what."

David was enormously gifted with a big heart and the desire to make others smile. An intellectual with a hankering for adventure. David made the most of his 40 plus years living in NYC. He loved the fast-paced lifestyle, was a member of several private clubs, and made generous donations to several beloved charities. The treasured New York views and the city energy invigorated him. Jogging and bicycling along the Hudson River was his favorite way to start the day. His love of theater, opera, and experiencing new restaurants kept him plenty busy. David's appreciation for gourmet food and wine found him dining in many of the world's finest restaurants. Even after enjoying an elegant dessert, he couldn't resist indulging in his nightly bowl of ice cream. He was happy to whip up his signature martinis and root beer floats on a moment's notice at any gathering.

David also had an unquenchable thirst for knowledge. He was an accomplished traveler and could speak intelligently to anyone about world history, politics, geography, and various cultures. His homes in New York, New Jersey and Florida displayed his carefully curated souvenirs, about which he would happily share his tales of acquisition.

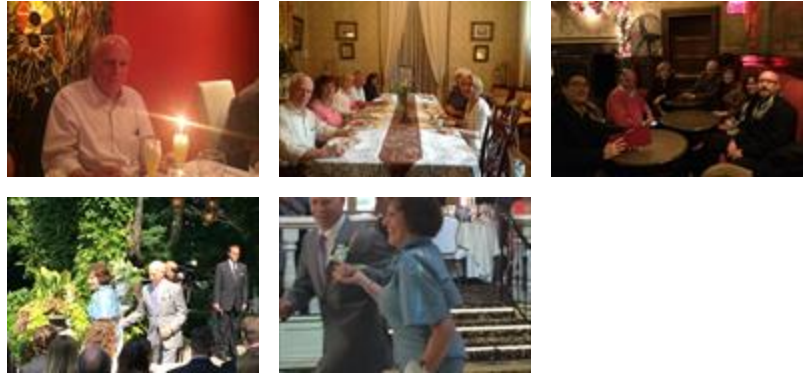

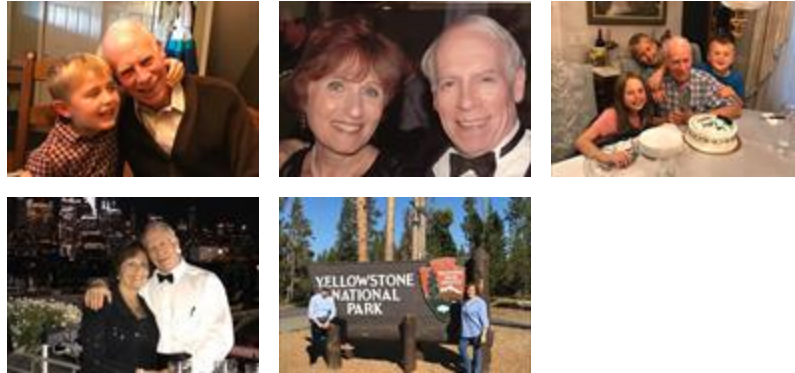
