David Allen Webster, Naples, Florida-Medina, New York — Passed away peacefully in his home as he wished on Sunday, February 11, 2018 in his home in Naples FL after a battle with cancer at the age of 69.

He grew up in Medina, NY, son of Walter D. Webster Jr. and Lone Marie Webster, a brother Bruce and sister Gail. Growing up, he helped on the family farm and enrolled in the United States Marine Corps before finishing high school and earned his GED while serving in the military. He received many awards namely the National Defense Service Medal; Vietnam Service Medal (4 years); Vietnam Campaign Medal w/device; Presidential Unit Citation; Combat Action Ribbon; Rifle Marksmanship Badge and was honorably discharged after completing his 4 years of service.

David spent his younger years helping out on the family farm before joining the United State Marine's. He spent a few years living and working in Hawaii but mostly lived in the Medina area. He started a carpet dying and cleaning business which he owned and operated with a franchise from Langenwalter Carpet dying, for several years in the Medina area. He loved music and enjoying spending time with friends and easily made new friends wherever he traveled. For the past 10 years or so he had resided full time in Naples, Florida with Beverly enjoying the warm weather and sunshine.

David was preceded in death by his first wife Wanda Nani Tom, and then his second wife Beverly.

David is survived by five children: Kevin Heideman, Tamara Stephen, Marisa Minonno, David Webster II, and Zachary Ausman; and 12 grandchildren. Felicia, Eric, Austin, Seath, Jacob, Malina, Chloe, Alex, Joey, Katie, Avery, and Emerson.
