Donald was born in Cambridge, Mass. After graduating from Braintree High School, he enlisted in the Army in 1966, serviced as a helicopter crew chief in Viet Nam, and was honorably discharged in 1969 with two Bronze Service Stars awarded.

Completing his military obligations, Donald was employed by Digital Equipment Corp. from 1970 to 2002. Rising from a wireman trainee to a Principle Hardware Engineer, his contributions help lay the ground work for server technology used today.

His numerous activities included sail boating, saltwater fly fishing, scuba diving, and underwater photography. With his retiring to Florida, he started a candle making business: Candles by Donald.

Donald leaved behind his wife of 44 years, Sue; son Gabe of Sarasota; father to nephew Phillip Wolf of Richmond, VA, and niece Danielle Parker of Lewiston, ME. Also, he leaves his brother, Stephen MacKinnon of Valdosta, GA; and numerous cousins, nieces, and nephews.

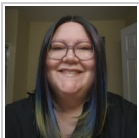
