With a helpful hand and an infectious sense of humor, George Anthony Hetzler, 90, brightened the lives of those in both Livonia, NY and Sarasota, FL. On April 14, 2023, George set sail on his final adventure. Funeral arrangements are entrusted to Gendron Funeral & Cremation Services Inc.

Born to the late Herman and Rosamond Hetzler on December 26, 1932, in Rochester, NY. A proud graduate of Aquinas High School, George's life took a turn for the better when he met his future wife Patricia Knapp on her 16th birthday on Longboat Key.
