Gladys Mae Bartos (nee Chatal), 89, passed away on April 9 at her home in Lehigh Acres, Florida. She was the wife of Paul C. Bartos who predeceased her in 2010, with whom she shared over 60 years of marriage.

Born in Bedford, Ohio, Gladys was the daughter of Edward and Grace Chatal who preceded her in death. She attended Bedford High School, graduating in 1948. During the 1950's she worked as an inspector at Chevrolet in Cleveland, Ohio, and in the 1970's to 1980's was a uniform attendant at the Coliseum in Richfield, Ohio, where she and Paul lived before moving to Florida in 1990 to retire.

She was preceded in death by three brothers, older brother Gene Chatal, and younger brother Jack Chatal and his wife Bernice, and younger brother James (Jimmy) Chatal, survived by wife Carol.

Gladys will always be remembered for her strong spirit, yet as a lighthearted and sweet person who was always there for her children. She loved cats and at one point cared for six of them. She liked to sew, crochet, and do crosswords and Sudoku puzzles as she grew older. Almost anyone who knew her well likely had a blanket she crocheted for them in their favorite color(s).

Gladys is survived by her four children: Ronald, Karen Street, William and

Sandra, three grandchildren: Michael Bartos, and Kelsey and Alexandra Glover, and two great grandchildren: Jacob Liam Shrake and Wilder James Dunigan. She also leaves behind nephews, nieces, grand nephews and nieces, cousins and second cousins.
