Greg didn't have any children, but he did have his precious fur babies, Sofie and Ginger. Who accompanied him everywhere, from everyday errands to helping Greg keep an eye on everyone at TBL. Although they crossed the rainbow bridge a few years back. He spoke of them daily and missed them

dearly.

Greg will forever be known as the legend of TBL, an icon in the LBGTQ community, and that friend with a heart of gold.
