She had four sisters and two brothers. All but one younger brother, John Davis of Missouri have preceded her in death. Jeannette died peacefully on March 11, 2014 at age 89. Jeannette was a skilled homemaker and prize winning cook. She and Jack enjoyed many cruises and other trips throughout the world. She enjoyed good health until the last year. Jeannette is survived by her husband Jack, her four children, five grandchildren, and seven great grandchildren. At her request, there will not be a memorial service. Burial will take place at Union Cemetery in Symmes Township, Hamilton County, Ohio.
