“ My mother and Aunt Sis were very close. My aunt always said that my mother was like a mother to her. Their mother died from cancer in 1938. The younger children were taken by the Catholic Bureau and placed in foster homes. Sis was 11. The rest of their childhood was sad. My uncle was in the Navy and then the Air Force. They moved around so much. When my Uncle Carl was away on assignment, Sis and my cousin Skip always stayed with us. Her last stop was Florida. Sis lived in three houses here. She always had a nice house and took good care of it. Sis loved dogs and always had at least one on her lap who worshiped her. I joined the Catholic Church in 2013. We had many conversations about the faith. On Sundays she watched the masses on the Eternal Word Television Network. In her last years she had trouble with her balance. She kept on falling and getting hurt. I would come to Florida every summer for a week to visit her. I was working on Ancestry to research the Patton family tree. She loved discussing her family history. This last week was my final visit with her. Even though she was in hospice, my sister and I felt she knew we were with her. We will miss you Aunt Sis. We will always love you. You are with your mother, father, 9 brothers and sisters, husband, son and daughter. Someday we will be together again.
