Michael (Mike) Dean Weaver, a cherished figure known for his exceptional heart, humor, and profound dedication to family, passed away on October 1, 2024, at the age of 80 in Fort Myers, Florida. Born on September 10, 1944, in Marion, Indiana, Mike's life was a testament to love, laughter, and unwavering care.

Mike's academic journey included his studies at Oak Hill High School, followed by further education at Indiana University, Ball State University, the University of South Florida, and Edison College. He proudly served in the United States Marine Corps Reserve, embracing the discipline and camaraderie that defined his time in the service.

Professionally, Mike worked in the field of retail as a department manager at JCPenney (where he met his wife). From 1973 onward, he dedicated his vocational life to real estate as a realtor and broker. He found immense joy in helping families find their perfect homes, a testament to his commitment to community and personal connection. His work was not just a job but a way to contribute positively to the lives of others.

A devout member of Wesley Memorial United Methodist Church in Fort Myers, Mike was deeply involved in his church community, where he also found a spiritual home.

Mike was a man of many interests, including the art of grilling, visiting the shooting range, attending car shows, getting on the floor and wrestling all the kids and grandkids, and playfully and lovingly flirting with his wife multiple times daily. Still, what brought him the greatest joy was simply being a husband, father, and, in later years, a terrific grandfather. He also loved to share great, stoic quotes like, ""Do you want a knuckle sandwich?," or "That's a great deal at twice the price," and "I can hardly wait until tomorrow—I'll be even better looking." He paired these with wise words, always showing love, assurance, and guidance to his family. The most significant and formative phrases he shared were, "I love you," "I am always proud of you," "You are never alone," and "That will put hair on your chest,"

Mike set a high standard for how a husband should love his wife. This same dedication extended to his role as a father to his children and grandchildren. He and Kathy provided their children with an abundance of love and care, always ensuring they knew they were valued and loved beyond measure. This same love was showered upon Mike and Kathy's grandchildren, who will forever know him as Papa.

He leaves behind his loving wife of nearly 55 years, Kathleen Weaver, and their children, Tracy McGee (John), Michael Weaver II (Kelly), and Brittany Shory (Greg). His legacy continues through his grandchildren, John McGee III (JT), Madison McGee, Myleigh Weaver, Karlie Weaver, Hannah Shory, and Rachel Shory. Mike is also survived by his sister, Patti Stanley, alongside many cousins, nieces, nephews, and friends. He was preceded in death by his parents, Wilfred and Betty Weaver, and a beloved circle of extended family and friends.
