Mimi Shapiro was born in Manhattan on December 22, 1928. She was the daughter of Pearl and Lou Lieberman, and was followed by Arthur, her cherished and only sibling. A true New Yorker by birth and in spirit, she had extraordinary charm, beauty and taste which led to an early career in modeling and a lifetime of impressing others with these virtues. Mimi changed her career to caring for her daughters, Meg and Pat, soon after her marriage to Mike (having subtly changed her own name at a young age and with a spouse known by his nickname, she insisted on keeping it simpler for her daughters right at the start). She lived a full life in the

suburbs for over 20 years, raising her children, surrounded by good friends and even agreeing to including a Great Dane to the family. Mimi moved back "home" to Manhattan and embarked on her next career, licensing products and developing movies based on comics - beginning with Conan the Barbarian brought to life by Arnold Schwarzenegger (also starting another career). Mike finally persuaded her to retire with him and move to Florida, closer to their daughter Meg and husband Phil, to spend more time with their growing family: Adam, Kevin and Lindsay. Thus began yet another career she excelled in, being a grandmother. Mimi hosted Pat's wedding to Francois (on a quick stopover from Ukraine) and opened her heart and home to their adopted sons, Michael and Soren. She pulled out all the stops staying in touch as they moved around the globe, traveling alone to meet in exotic places until she was close to 80. Mimi outlived her husband, brother and many friends but is leaving behind a wake of family and friends who will remember her outer and inner beauty, her humor and her sense of adventure. Although she suffered from a disease which dulled her senses, it never dulled her own unique sparkle until the very end. Her passing leaves a large void but also the opportunity to travel back with her to endless good memories
