Paul Michael Galestro passed away on February 8, 2021 peacefully in his sleep at home in North Port, FL. He was born on June 10, 1958 in Canarsie Brooklyn, NY. Paul, aka Rastus Kain – The Unknown Bluesman – with his gifted songwriting as he shines with his slide playing on his 1966 Gibson Firebird.

Paul and his wife April would travel together across the country to Blues Festivals and other shows to pursue his career. Paul also toured Germany with James Peterson and even played in St. Croix. In his early years he played with the Dust Bunnies & The Blynders and the Mercy Road. Paul had shared the stage with numerous musicians like Tab Benoit, Paul Nelson of Johnny Winter, Derek Trucks and Kat Riggins to name a few.

Paul is survived by his wife and soulmate of 20 years April Galestro, his wonderful sister JoAnn Rich (who turned him on to Johnny Winter when there kids), daughter Angela Galestro (who is following in his footsteps in music along with her husband Jonathan Smith).

Paul will be loved and missed by all who enjoyed his music. He will always be remembered. RIP – Bluesman.
