



Stefan Grundstrom

March 15, 1952 - November 6, 2024

Stefan Grundstrom, age 72 passed peacefully on November 6, 2024 after a long struggle with vascular dementia. He was a resident of Sarasota since 2021 and previously of South Park, Pennsylvania.

Stefan was born March 15, 1952 100 miles north of the Arctic Circle (as he would often tell new acquaintances) in Kiruna, Sweden to Erik and Anne-Louise Grundstrom. Stefan became a licensed pilot in Sweden on his 16th birthday which was the youngest age one could qualify. After later serving as a fighter pilot in the Swedish Air Force, Stefan found himself in the USA (Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania) where he met his wife, Lynne.

Stefan truly was a man of many talents and a "Jack of All Trades." He worked as a coal-miner in Western Pennsylvania, a teacher with the local community college, obtained his U.S. Citizenship, then pursued a Bachelor's degree in Information Technology from the University of Pittsburgh, and later went on to working for Bettis / Bechtel, Sun Microsystems, and PNC Bank, where he retired in 2015. An avid shooter, he spent most Sundays at the local gun clubs shooting trap & skeet but mostly it was for hanging at the local bar afterward with his buddies.

Preceded in death by his parents, he leaves behind his devoted wife of 48 years Lynne Grundstrom and their daughter Kira (Henry) Kellner; sister Marie

(Torbjorn) Bodin; grandchildren Shane (Selina) Foley, Destinee Kellner & Isabella Kellner; and great-grandson Ian Foley.

To honor Stefan's last wishes, no funeral service will be held. Instead, the family asks that in lieu of flowers, memorial donations be made to a charity of your choice.

My deepest condolences to your family who've truly lost a bright light in their lives. May God sustain them during this difficult time...

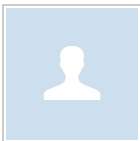

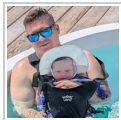
