Steven Raucci, 83, of Lehigh Acres, Florida, passed away on Friday, February 20, 2026, after a brief illness. Steve passed peacefully with his wife holding his hand and reciting the rosary to him.

Steve was born in New Haven, CT on April 14, 1942 to Stephen and Marie Raucci of West Haven, CT. Steve dedicated his life to his family, his work and his love of golf. Neighbors would stop and chat while Steve would ride his bike around his neighborhood or while he was working on the landscape around his home.
